- VII. Discussion and/or action to approve of the 2023 Consumer Price Index (CPI) adjustment to Municipal Telecommunications Right-of-Way Access Line Rates for 2023 and authorize a 4.2883% increase in the maximum access line rates for the year 2023 due to inflation as measured by the 2023 CPI, or approve of the continuance of the existing 2022 maximum access line rates; and authorize the City Administrator to submit any required requests or documentation regarding the maximum access line rates for 2023 to the Public Utility Commission.
 - CM Burton made a motion to approve of the 2023 Consumer Price Index (CPI) adjustment to Municipal Telecommunications Right-of-Way Access Line Rates for 2023 and authorize a 4.2883% increase in the maximum access line rates for the year 2023 due to inflation as measured by the 2023 CPI; and to authorize the City Administrator to submit any required requests or documentation regarding the maximum access line rates for 2023 to the Public Utility Commission. CM Wallace seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously (4-0).

 - CM Wallace made a motion to approve the payment of up to \$650 for the labor to repair the ceiling at the Senior Citizen building. CM Skupin seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously (4-0).
